SUBJECT: Defense Security Cooperation Agency DSCA Policy Memorandum 23-17, Contract Administration Services Fee for Air Force Installation Contracting Center Foreign Military Sales Contracts [SAMM E-Change 626]

References: (a) Memorandum of Agreement Between the U.S. Air Force Security Assistance and Cooperation Directorate and the U.S. Air Force Installation Contracting Agency F4FHES-19-0001 dated, 22 March 2019

Based on a review of reference (a), DSCA determined Contract Administration Services (CAS) elements, including quality assurance and inspection, and contract administration management, should not be applied to U.S. Air Force Security Assistance and Cooperation (AFSAC)-managed case lines with the Air Force Installation Contracting Center (AFICC) design and construction contracts. AFICC performs quality assurance and inspection, and contract administration management, on their contracts with AFSAC. These services are directly charged to the associated Foreign Military Sales (FMS) case line. This memorandum is effective immediately, and all new AFSAC-managed FMS cases shall not include surcharges related to quality assurance and inspection, and contract administration management, on lines with design and construction contracts assigned to AFICC. The design and construction line note in the Letter of Offer and Acceptance (LOA) must identify that the design and construction contract is assigned to AFICC. AFSAC will manually override pricing from "AP" to "NA" for quality assurance and inspection, and contract administration management, CAS elements in DSAMS

for the design and construction contract is assigned to AFICC. The policy in the attachment is incorporated into the DSCA Security Assistance Management Manual (SAMM) at https://samm.dsca.mil.

# CONTRACT ADMINISTRATION FEE FOR AIR FORCE INSTALLATION CONTRACTING CENTER FOREIGN MILITARY SALES CONTRACTS

1. Update SAMM Table C9.T4 to clarify CAS elements as 1, 2, and 3, and add language regarding AFICC design and construction to the CAS Surcharge section.
