SUBJECT: Defense Security Cooperation Policy Memorandum 24-59, Combatant Command Oversight of Building Partner Capacity Transfer Documents [SAMM E-Change 706]

Effective immediately, this policy memo updates SAMM Chapter 15 and Chapter 15-Legacy to require Combatant Command Oversight of Building Partner Capacity transfer documents, as required by Department of Defense Office of the Inspector General "Audit of the DoD's Management of Global Train and Equip Resources Provided to U.S. Africa Command Partner Nations (DODIG-2021-102)." Clarification is also made concerning how Title 10 and Title 22 resources are requested by the geographic Combatant Commands.
